

Tadashi SHIRAISHI

Tadashi Shiraishi is Professor at the University of Tokyo Graduate Schools for Law and Politics. He majors in competition law.



Professor Shiraishi's first monograph was on essential intellectual properties (*The Legal Structure of Technology and Competition Law* (Yuhikaku, 1994, in Japanese)), after graduating from the University of Tokyo Faculty of Law and spending some years as a Research Associate there. He taught at Tohoku University in Sendai, 1991-97, before he joined the University of Tokyo in 1997.

Professor Shiraishi has contributed to, among others, systematic understanding of competition laws. He has published an educational textbook, *An Introduction to the Competition Law of Japan* (Yuhikaku, in Japanese) with the first edition in 1997 and the latest seventh edition in 2014. He has also published a treatise for professionals, *Competition Law of Japan* (Yuhikaku, in Japanese) with the first edition in 2006 and the latest third edition in 2016. He has been planning to promote them to a global analysis.
