SHIRAISHI Tadashi is Professor of the University of Tokyo, Graduate Schools for Law and Politics, in charge of competition law. He taught at Tohoku University, 1991-97, before he joined the University of Tokyo in 1997. Professor Shiraishi has contributed to, among others, systematic understanding of competition laws. He has published an educational textbook (1st ed. 1997 and 8th ed. 2018) and a treatise for professionals (1st ed. 2006 and 3rd ed. 2016) in Japanese.
