Tadashi SHIRAISHI is Professor of the University of Tokyo, Graduate Schools for Law and Politics, majoring in competition law. He taught at Tohoku University, 1991-97, before he moved to the University of Tokyo in 1997. Professor Shiraishi has contributed to systematic understanding of competition laws, publishing a treatise and a textbook in Japanese. He also translated David Gerber's *Competition Law and Antitrust* (2020) into Japanese in 2021.
